**ORDER**

The facts underlying this order are contained in the trial transcript, the parties' post-trial briefs, the May 14, 2025, order of the First District Appellate Court in this matter, and Telisa Johnson's motion for an order *nunc pro tunc* or alternative relief.

This court further finds that:

1. Pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 5/2-1202, 735 ILCS 5/2-1202, and *Manning v. City of Chicago*, 407 Ill. App. 3d 849, 851-52 (2011), Johnson timely filed her various motions for extension of time to file her post-trial motion, albeit with some of the filings occurring late in the 30-day period;
2. For various reasons, this court was unavailable to execute each of the orders on the days Johnson provided them to this court and within the 30-day period provided by the statute;
3. This court plainly intended for Johnson to receive additional time to file her post-trial motion as this court entered the orders for extensions of time, the parties fully briefed the post-trial motion, and this court issued a written opinion denying Johnson's request for post-trial relief; and
4. This court does not believe that Johnson should be prejudiced in her attempt to appeal the jury's verdict based on the dates this court entered orders on her motions for extension of time to file her post-trial motion.

Based on these findings, it is ordered that:

1. The date stamp of the order granting Johnson's second motion for extension of time is modified to October 10, 2023, *nunc pro tunc*;
2. The date stamp of the order granting Johnson's third motion for extension of time is modified to November 7, 2023, *nunc pro tunc*;
3. The date stamp of the order granting Johnson's fourth motion for extension of time is modified to December 5, 2023, *nunc pro tunc*; and
4. This court's June 11, 2025, order is stricken.
